



Examination Papers and Copyright Protected Material

Reproducing works for exam papers

You may reproduce any copyright material that is needed for inclusion in an exam paper – whether as a question or as an answer.

s.200 (1) (b) of the Copyright Act states that there is no infringement of copyright in a work, or an adaptation of a work, when it is copied "as part of the questions to be answered in an examination, or in an answer to such a question."

There is no restriction on the amount of a work that can be reproduced under this section - i.e. it can exceed the 'reasonable portion' of (usually) 10% or 1 chapter of a work.

Reproducing past exam papers

An exam paper which relies on this section to reproduce more than a 'reasonable portion' of a copyright work should not later be copied as a practice test paper or a teaching resource because these purposes lie outside the scope of the section.
