



PROVIDING UNIT READERS ON CD-ROM

Unit readings can be provided to students on CD-ROM under the CAL Licence, with similar requirements as for printed readers, plus others specific to this format.

Reasonable portion provisions must be observed for any third party unauthorised copyright material used according to the CAL licence, e.g.:

- 10% or 1 chapter of a book - whichever is greater;
- one article from an issue of a periodical – two or more may be used if they concern the same (narrowly specified) topic as the first;
- any item of fewer than 15 pages from an anthology.

Limits also apply to material copied from the internet and other electronic sources:

- if an electronic literary or dramatic work is not paginated then 10% of the words in the item is considered to be a 'reasonable portion' to copy;
- one article from an issue of an online periodical such as an e-journal, e-zine, or online newspaper may be copied – two or more articles may be copied if they concern the same topic as the first;
- you may use any image in electronic form for educational purposes;
- you may use any material if you have the copyright owner's permission to do so – some websites grant this right to educational institutions and other non-profit organisations: check the site's copyright statement.

Be aware that licences, subscriptions, and/or 'click-through' terms of agreement applying to online databases, commercial CD-ROMs, and other digital resources, software, websites, etc. may not allow any copying of their materials, and may override the Copyright Act and statutory licences such as the CAL licence.

Attribution of each item (including images) on the CD-ROM must accord with standard academic practice. This is a Moral Rights requirement as well as a licence requirement.

You must have the copyright owner's permission to reproduce material that does not fall under the CAL licence, e.g. unpublished work, student work, emails, etc.

Such items should be fully acknowledged, together with a statement that they are reproduced with permission of the copyright owner; a written copy of the permission should be retained by the unit coordinator.

Copyright management information such as bar codes, publisher names, copyright statements etc. must be retained when making a digital copy. It is an offence to remove such information.

A record of the readings on the CD-ROM and of the number of CDs issued must be made and retained by the Unit Coordinator.

Any charge to students for provision of the CD-ROM must be only on a cost recovery basis.

CD-Rom readers are to be made available only to 'authorised users', i.e. students and staff of the Murdoch University. The CD Cover should incorporate a statement reflecting this.

The Copyright Warning Notice (below) must appear as the first item seen every time the CD is opened for use.
