

## UNIT READINGS & ONLINE DELIVERY

Anything you have written yourself can be delivered to students via your LMS site

### Third-party material may be used on an LMS site when:

- the copyright is owned by the University;
- the material has been supplied to the University with a licence to copy;
- the material has been made available with a **Creative Commons** licence;
- the material is in the Public Domain;
- the copyright owner grants you written permission to use a work (record of any such arrangement must be sent to the copyright coordinator: [copyright@murdoch.edu.au](mailto:copyright@murdoch.edu.au)).

### The use of any other third party copyright materials

All other copyright protected material should be delivered to students via the Electronic Course Management Service (ECMS): **it must not reside within a unit on the LMS.**

**NB** this includes PowerPoint presentations incorporating copyright protected items such as images, graphs, or maps; PowerPoints may be delivered via either ECMS or Lectopia.

These materials are also known as 'unauthorised third party works' because they can be used without specific permission or fees; they are used and paid for under the University's licence with the Copyright Agency Ltd.

### Electronic Course Materials Service

Because of the complexity of legislation and licences covering electronic copying and communication of copyright protected materials, the University manages all electronic delivery of these works through its central repository, **ECMS**.

Students can reach the ECMS collection either directly from an LMS site or via the Library catalogue. Materials are searchable by author, article/chapter title, keywords, course code, and lecturer's name.
