

## **COPYRIGHT-FREE/FRIENDLY DIGITAL IMAGES FOR EDUCATIONAL USE**

**images** in the following categories are not used under the CAL licence, and can be delivered via your LMS site, or via an openly accessible non-commercial website

### **CREATIVE COMMONS licensed works** <http://creativecommons.org/>

Creative Commons is a 'some rights reserved' licensing system allowing creators to release their works in less restrictive ways than those imposed by copyright legislation.

Every licence allows licensees to, at least:

- copy the work; distribute it; display or perform it publicly; make digital public performances of it (e.g. webcasting); shift the work into another format as a verbatim copy

Beyond this, the various licences may require attribution, allow the creation of derivative works, permit only non-commercial uses, etc; one license allows the licensor to relinquish all their exclusive copyright in a work and dedicate it to the Public Domain.

### **PUBLIC DOMAIN images**

'public domain' means that copyright in the work has expired or been relinquished; public domain works can, usually, be freely used by anyone

#### **photographs in which copyright has expired**

- a photograph taken before 1955 is now in the Public Domain: there is no restriction on its use

however,

- a photograph published between 1<sup>st</sup> January 1955 and 1<sup>st</sup> May 1969 has 50 years protection from the date of its publication: if that was, for instance, during 1957 - it is now in the public domain; if it was published on 30th April 1969, it will come the public domain on 1<sup>st</sup> May 2019

and

- a photograph published after 1<sup>st</sup> May 1969 has protection for 70 years from the date of its creator's death e.g. if the creator died on 2<sup>nd</sup> May 1969, the photograph will not come into the Public Domain until 2039

### **images other than photographs in which copyright has expired**

- if the creator died before 1<sup>st</sup> January 1955, the work is now in the public domain
- if the creator was alive on 1<sup>st</sup> January 1955, their works are protected for seventy years from the date of their death
