Position Purpose

The Necropsy Technician supports and co-ordinates the technical aspects of teaching, research and diagnostic activities undertaken in the necropsy suite, including hands on involvement in animal post-mortems. The position is responsible for the maintenance, cleanliness and good order of the necropsy suite and for maintaining accurate client records and pathology databases.

The Necropsy Technician works with the broader Anatomy and Pathology Team to provide cover and support for the Anatomical Pathology Technician, as well as other team members.


Murdoch is also committed to building engagement with our local community, State, nation, and global society with a track-record in creating strong partnerships with business, government and industry.

Reporting Relationships



Key Responsibilities/Duties

- 1. Responsible for the general cleanliness and good order of the necropsy suite and the operational supply and maintenance of equipment and consumables for the necropsy suite.
- 2. Assist pathologists and assist and advise researchers and students in the performance of necropsy procedures and be responsible for the associated cleaning of the area and instruments and the appropriate disposal of remains.
- Record and charge for accessions using EzyVet.
- 4. Document and submit samples from necropsy unit to other service areas.
- 5. Provide technical support for teaching, diagnostic and research activities in the Pathology area including filing, storage and data entry.
- 6. Perform mammalian necropsy procedures under the direction of a pathologist.
- 7. Arrange collection of animals and specimens from outside sources. Process animals submitted for disposal in accordance with section's policies and procedures.

- 8. Responsible for ensuring that all activities undertaken meet the relevant University policies and legislative requirements and guidelines.
- Prepare and maintain standard operating procedures for Necropsy tasks.
- 10. Carry out, and assist with, other duties as required.

Selection Criteria

Essential

- 1. Completion of a relevant degree or an equivalent combination of relevant experience and/or education/training in industries with a transferrable skillset to the necropsy technician position.
- 2. Knowledge of necropsy techniques and procedures and a demonstrated ability to work with animal cadavers and animal specimens.
- 3. Experience maintaining accurate laboratory records and notes and excellent organisational skills with ability to prioritise tasks and cope with competing demands.
- 4. Strong interpersonal and communication skills with the ability to liaise with stakeholders at all levels.
- 5. Demonstrated ability to work independently and to be an effective team member.
- 6. Good computer skills with word processing, spreadsheet and database experience plus the ability to learn new programs such as EzyVet.

Desirable

- 1. Experience assisting with post-mortems.
- 2. Current First Aid Certificate
- 3. MR Truck licence

Work Requirements

- 1. Australian permanent residency or possession of a valid visa with work entitlement in Australia.
- 2. Be able to provide evidence of appropriate vaccination or immunity in accordance with the University's Immunisation Policy.
- 3. Forklift licence or the ability to obtain a forklift licence if requested.
- 4. Current C Class Australian driver's licence
- 5. Ability to work outside of normal office hours when required.
