Position Purpose

This role contributes to a GRDC-supported project, "Cold plasma treatment of wheat and canola for enhanced plant growth, vigour, and yield." The Research Fellow will play a key role in designing and conducting field trials across Australia to assess the impact of cold plasma treatments on wheat and canola growth, yield, and disease tolerance.

Working as part of a collaborative research team, the appointee will receive guidance and support from the Project Leader while conducting research with an increasing degree of independence. They will also contribute to a limited range of administrative and service activities relevant to the project.

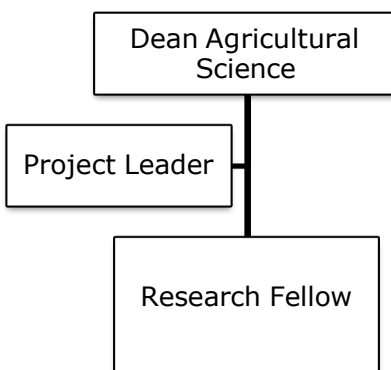

Research projects are supported by GRDC, Hort Innovation and the Future Food Systems CRC, and most involve postgraduate students. The Postdoctoral Research associate/fellow will be part of the larger Plant Pathology Group.

Key Responsibilities/Duties

1. Conduct independent and collaborative research within the GRDC-funded project UMU2503-004RTX, specifically designing and executing field trials to evaluate the impact of cold plasma and plasma-activated water treatments on grain and oilseed crops.
2. Publish high-quality research findings in international peer-reviewed journals, industry reports, and other scholarly outputs.
3. Contribute to securing external research funding by assisting with competitive grant applications in collaboration with research team members.
4. Supervise, mentor, and provide guidance to postgraduate and HDR students as appropriate.
5. Support the research group through the development and implementation of safe laboratory practices and standard operating procedures.
6. Actively contribute to the School, University, profession, and discipline through committee participation, outreach, and engagement activities.
7. Engage in the University's Academic Career Development Conversation (ACDC) process to support professional growth and career progression.
8. Undertake other research-related duties as directed by the primary supervisor.

Selection Criteria

Essential

1. A completed PhD degree in plant science or crop and pasture science with at least two years relevant postdoctoral experience.
2. Demonstrated experience in plant science research including design and implementation of laboratory, glasshouse and field trials, appropriate analysis and presentation of results, and the publication of findings in relevant journals.
3. Demonstrated ability to work under broad direction, exercise initiative in undertaking responsibilities and work effectively as a team member.
4. Demonstrated ability to engage in high quality research as evidenced through publication in reputable international journals.
5. Well-developed interpersonal skills and the ability to work effectively as a member of an interdisciplinary and collegial team, including partnerships with industry.
6. Demonstrated high levels of written and oral communication skills in English.

Desirable

1. Experience in the preparation and application of cold plasma and/or plasma activated water
2. Ability and commitment to supervise and/or mentor postgraduate students
3. Ability to work outside normal office hours and in rural and regional areas when required.

Work Requirements

1. Australian permanent residency or possession of a valid visa with work entitlement in Australia.
