Murdoch is also committed to building engagement with our local community, State, nation, and global society with a track-record in creating strong partnerships with business, government and industry.


### **About the Work Area**

# **Key Responsibilities/Duties**

- 1. Provide emergency veterinary services and ongoing care for companion animals (including exotics) in the Emergency and Critical Care section of The Animal Hospital at Murdoch University (TAHMU).
- 2. Diagnose and make therapeutic treatment recommendations on small companion animals.
- 3. Strict adherance to University and TAHMU policies, procedures and protocols. Strict adherance with The Veterinary Surgeons' Act of WA and other veterinary industry related Acts and Regulations.
- 4. Provide support and training to specialty trainees, students, visiting veterinarians and veterinary nurses in all aspects of emergency medicine and critical care.
- 5. Provide advice to other TAHMU staff on emergency medicine and critical care related matters.
- 6. Enter account details and other relevant patient data on hospital networked computer system, and maintain accurate hospital patient records in a timely manner.
- 7. Ensure accurate and complete estimations and billing of all cases during shift and adhere to relevant hospital policy.

- 8. Communicate directly with ECC clients to ensure they are fully informed of prescribed treatments and costs.
- 9. Participate in the after-hours roster, including day, evening, weekend, public holiday and university holiday shifts.
- 10. Manage workflow effectively within the department and ensure all necessary duties are completed in a timely manner.
- 11. Develop and maintain good working relationships with referring veterinarians, both within TAHMU and outside practices.
- 12. Manage adverse incidents and complaints appropriately, resolve if possible and bring to the attention of the Veterinary Supervisor, Academic Leader or Hospital Operations Manager.
- 13. Maintain an up-to-date working knowledge of specified University software packages and Microsoft Office applications.

### **Selection Criteria**

#### **Essential**

- 1. Veterinary degree registrable by the Veterinary Surgeons' Board of Western Australia.
- 2. Relevant post-graduate qualifications or training or experience.
- 3. Ability to work rotational shift work, including night shifts, weekends and public holidays and be flexible in work hour patterns.
- 4. Excellent organisational, time and workload management skills, including the ability to prioritise workload to meet strict deadlines.
- 5. Highly effective communication, customer service and interpersonal skills, and the demonstrated ability to interact constructively and collaboratively with staff at all levels of the organisation.
- 6. Demonstrated ability to use initiative, assume responsibility for tasks and projects and to resolve problems.
- 7. Demonstrated ability to work cohesively in a team environment.

### **Desirable**

- 1. Previous experience working in a veterinary teaching hospital or veterinary referral hospital.
- 2. Demonstrated computer skills and experience with computer systems used in veterinary practices, in particular ezyVet and Vet Radar.
- 3. Experience in teaching at a tertiary level.

### **Work Requirements**

- 1. Ability to work outside of normal office hours when required.
- 2. Be able to provide evidence of appropriate vaccination or immunity in accordance with the University's Immunisation Policy. Please check the <u>Immunisation Policy</u> if the role requires this).
