
About the Work Area

Key Responsibilities/Duties

- 1. Provide high level anaesthesia and analgesia services to clinical sections within The Animal Hospital At Murdoch University (TAHMU) under the supervision of senior anaesthetists.
- 2. Assist senior anaesthetists with the day-to-day management of anaesthesia patients, including providing advice to other clinicians about animals requiring anaesthesia and perioperative analgesia and effectively treating and managing cases under their supervision and direction as appropriate.
- 3. Provide support and training to specialty trainees, students, visiting veterinarians and veterinary nurses in all aspects of anaesthesia and analgesia.
- 4. Strict adherance to University and TAHMU policies, procedures and protocols. Strict adherance with The Veterinary Surgeons' Act of WA and other veterinary industry related Acts and Regulations.
- 5. Assist with the collection of blood from donors and the processing of blood products for use in the hospital.
- 6. Provide advice at the appropriate level to other TAHMU staff on anaesthesia and analgesia related matters.
- 7. Enter account details and other relevant patient data on hospital networked computer system, and maintain accurate hospital patient records in a timely manner.

- 8. Ensure accurate and complete estimations and billing of all cases during shift and adhere to relevant hospital policy.
- 9. Participate in the after-hours roster, including day, evening, weekend, public holiday and university holiday shifts.
- 10. Manage workflow efficiently and autonomously within the department and ensure all necessary duties are completed in a timely manner.
- 11. Develop and maintain good working relationships with referring veterinarians, both within TAHMU and outside practices.
- 12. Manage adverse incidents and complaints appropriately, resolve if possible and bring to the attention of the Lecturer in Veterinary Anaesthesia or Hospital Operations Manager.
- 13. Maintain an up-to-date working knowledge of specified University software packages and Microsoft Office applications.

Selection Criteria

Essential

- 1. Veterinary degree registrable by the Veterinary Surgeons' Board of Western Australia.
- 2. Ability to participate in the after-hours roster, including day, evening, weekend, public holiday and university holiday shifts.
- 3. Highly effective communication, customer service and interpersonal skills, and the demonstrated capability and willingness to interact constructively with staff at all levels of an organisation.
- 4. Excellent organisational, time and workload management skills, including the ability to prioritise workload to meet strict deadlines.
- 5. Demonstrated ability to use initiative, assume responsibility for tasks and projects and to resolve problems.
- 6. Demonstrated ability to work cohesively in a team environment.

Desirable

- 1. Previous experience working in a veterinary teaching hospital or veterinary referral hospital.
- 2. Large animal anesthesia experience
- 3. Demonstrated computer skills and experience with computer systems used in veterinary practices.

Work Requirements

- 1. Ability to work outside of normal office hours when required.
- 2. Be able to provide evidence of appropriate vaccination or immunity in accordance with the University's Immunisation Policy. Please check the <u>Immunisation Policy</u> if the role requires this).
