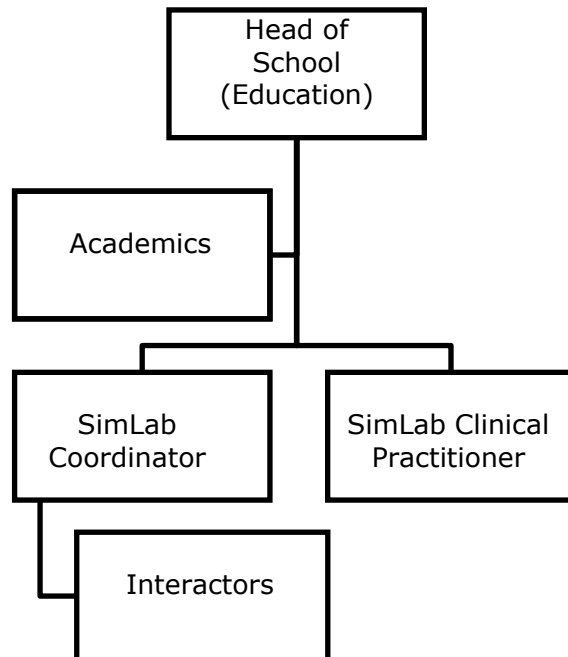

Key Responsibilities/Duties

1. Interpret key avatar archetypes and perform single or multiple avatars simultaneously for simulated training experiences for internal and external client bases.
2. Sustain consistent performances across character types for each SimLab™ user experience.
3. Set up the Interactors Operations room for each experience and ensure an effectivelink with the SimLab™ classroom.
4. Provide an informal scoring and/or comment for each student performance that may be moderated with the SimLab™ clinical practitioner.
5. Independently set up online SimLab™ experiences using Zoom including establishing the connection, briefing users, running the experience and concluding the session.
6. Maintain ongoing relevant professional development through relevant training and moderation programs.

7. Respond to client service requests by adapting specific scenarios to suit stakeholder needs.
8. Liaise with SimLab™ Coordinator and Technician to ensure all operations are viable.
9. Liaise with SimLab™ Coordinator and Clinical Practitioner to ensure alignment with the Unit Learning Outcomes and requirements.
10. Provide communication and feedback to the SimLab™ Team and Coordinator in the operational aspects of the simulation Scenarios to ensure a consistent team delivery
11. Participate in event and Scenario planning and meetings to provide technical expertise and guidance on capabilities and limitations of equipment and facilities.
12. Develop and maintain technical proficiency with all aspects of simulation operational delivery.
13. Conduct routine SimLab™ maintenance on Scenario development and delivery support materials and identify opportunities for strategic Scenario improvements.
14. Possible development of research materials based on Interactor reflections.
15. Other duties as directed by Head of Discipline.

Selection Criteria

Essential

1. Background in Performing Arts.
2. Qualified SimLab™ performer through Murdoch training program.
3. Extensive experience as a performer, ideally within a simulation environment.
4. Ability to work collaboratively with the SimLab™ team and Academic staff.
5. Strong technical skills.
6. Available to work flexible hours.
7. Positive communication skills (both written and oral) with a range of audiences, including students and staff.

Desirable

1. Experience working within the tertiary sector within a simulation environment
2. Adaptable to change
3. Initiative to problem solve
4. Ability to stay calm and manage others in stressful situations
5. Passionate about developing best practice teaching PST
6. Open to ongoing Professional Development

Work Requirements
