The Strategy is focused on three key themes:


- Sustainability: Be a leading university in education, teaching and translational research in sustainability.

## **Key Responsibilities / Duties**

- 5. Engage with a network of relevant contacts locally, nationally, and internationally, for the purposes of research collaboration and the enhancement of the academic reputation of the School and the University.
- 6. Help to maintain industry partnerships and participate in opportunities for new research partnerships.
- 7. Represent Murdoch University through involvement in professional associations, conferences, and other activities that contribute to research impact outside academia (i.e., societal, and environmental impact).
- 8. Contribute to the College, the University, the profession, and the discipline.
- 9. Participate in the University's Annual Career Development Conversation (ACDC) process.
- 10. Undertake such other duties as determined by the Supervising Academic (e.g., grant writing).

#### **Selection Criteria**

# **Essential**

- 1. A PhD in ecology or other environmental science.
- 2. Demonstrated ability to work under broad direction, exercise initiative in undertaking responsibilities and work effectively in a team.
- 3. Demonstrated ability to engage in high quality independent research, with an established record of scholarly publications.
- 4. Demonstrate excellent verbal/visual communication skills evidenced by presentations at scientific conferences.
- 5. Well-developed interpersonal skills and the ability to work effectively as a member of an interdisciplinary and collegial team.
- 6. Demonstrated high levels of written and oral communication skills in English.

#### **Desirable**

- 1. Willingness to engage in professional development.
- 2. Willingness to engage in two-way science with Indigenous peoples.
- 3. Demonstrated ability and commitment to successfully supervise honours and HDR students.

## **Work Requirements**

- 1. Ability to work outside of regular office hours occasionally when required.
- 2. Willingness and ability to travel nationally and internationally occasionally.
- 3. Australian permanent residency or possession of a valid visa with work entitlement in Australia.

## **Probationary Review**

This position may be subject to a probationary period, during which time the academic staff member is required to meet set probationary objectives and pass a probationary review. Probationary objectives are set following appointment to the position and confirmed at the first Annual Career Development Conversation (ACDC).
