About the Work Area



Key Responsibilities/Duties

- 1. Manage the procurement, installation and maintenance of the IT Discipline's Physical and Virtual IT infrastructure including (but not limited to) servers, network infrastructure, storage infrastructure, supporting infrastructure (UPS & Cooling), IoT infrastructure, licenses, SSL certificates and applications. This includes monitoring and backup of the relevant systems.
- 2. Manage the procurement, installation and maintenance of the Virtual and Physical IT Discipline Computer Labs hardware and software.
- 3. Enforce security policies, working with security to ensure a safe work environment for staff and students; with an emphasis on integrating with the ITS managed domain to standardise access control by making use of SSO. This includes maintaining the discipline's Active Directory Organizational Units and Group Policy ensuring that users have the appropriate access to resources.
- 4. Prepare user, systems, program, and support documentation to the required standard and provide users with software support and training. This includes developing and maintaining the discipline's SharePoint repositories hosting course content, file sharing and documentation.

- 5. Keep up to date with current technologies to provide relevant advice and assistance on IT hardware and software, to Academic staff for Teaching and Research activities.
- 6. Assist IT academic staff with the development and setup of outreach activities and displays.
- 7. Liaise and collaborate with central IT Services to achieve the procurement, security, and configuration tasks, under their Murdoch University Policy directed control.
- 8. Carry out and assist with other duties as directed by the line manager.

Selection Criteria

Essential

- 1. Completion of a degree in computer science, information technology or related fields with subsequent relevant experience.
- 2. Demonstrated ability to maintain and support a variety of computing environments (including virtual servers) running under different operating systems including Windows, Linux and OSX.
- 3. Demonstrated ability to configure IT Infrastructure and communicate technical information to peers and layman clients.
- 4. Relevant experience in installing, configuring, upgrading, and troubleshooting of software and hardware used in Computer Science, Game Development, Networking and Security, Mobile Applications Development, Virtual, Augmented and Mixed Reality, and artificial intelligence.
- 5. High interpersonal skills and the ability to work under pressure and to prioritise tasks.

Desirable

- 1. Knowledge of Python and Rasberry Pi software development and hardware interfacing
- 2. CCNA Certification.

Work Requirements

- 1. Australian permanent residency or possession of a valid visa with work entitlement in Australia.
- 2. The occupant of this position will be required to undertake a criminal record check in accordance with the University's Employee Background checks procedure.
- 3. Ability to work outside of normal office hours when required.
